May calls for service showed a significant increase from last month with total reported calls of 550 within the Town of High Level.

There were 2 drug related investigations which are still under investigation.

There were 44 total reported assaults; of these 35 were common Assault, 1 Aggravated assault, 4 were an Assault with a Weapon or Causing Bodily Harm One report of pointing a firearm and 3 assaults on police officers. There were 15 charges laid as a result of these complaints, 10 cleared using officer discretion and 6 determined to be unfounded. A charge was also laid for forcible confinement.

There were also 7 complaints of Sexual Assault resulting in 2 charges being laid and 5 remaining under investigation.

There were 5 complaints of harassment, 1 was determined to be unfounded and 4 remain under investigation. There were 9 complaints of uttering threats, with 3 cleared otherwise, 4 resulting in charges being laid and 2 under investigation. There was also 1 complaint of robbery which resulted in a charge being laid.

There were 22 traffic related complaints, with 13 Provincial charges being laid for various infractions. There were criminal charges laid for dangerous operation and flight from police.

There were 5 traffic collisions resulting in property damage.

There were 112 Liquor Act related incidents, and 109 were cleared with officer discretion and the subjects were lodged until they were sober and able to care for themselves.

There were 141 calls for mischief/damage to property or obstruction of enjoyment of property resulting in 5 charges being laid, 5 determined to be unfounded and the rest were cleared using officer discretion.

There were 7 reported thefts under \$5000 complaints resulting in 1 charge being laid, 1 cleared using officer discretion, 1 deemed unfounded and 4 remain under investigation.

May also included 3 complaints of motor vehicle thefts resulting in one charge laid.


There were 6 complaints of break and enter resulting in 3 charges being laid.

There were 4 complaints of possession of stolen property which resulted in 3 charges being laid.

There were 10 reports of missing persons, all have been located.

There were 62 miscellaneous calls including well being checks, assistance to the General Public, Suspicious persons/vehicles, animal calls and false alarms. There were 13 mental health related calls where individuals were referred to or dealt with via the hospital mental health services.

There were 25 complaints for failing to comply with court orders, 26 calls for disturbing the peace, 6 obstruction/resisting arrest files, 1 trespass at night and 1 uttering threats against property. These complaints resulted in 22 charges being laid, 23 cleared using officer discretion and 4 deemed to be unfounded.

Dear Mayor Crystal MacAteer,

Please find attached the quarterly Community Policing Report for High Level Detachment. This report serves to provide an overview of the human resources, financial data, and crime statistics for the January 1<sup>st</sup> to March 31<sup>st</sup>, 2022 reporting period. Community engagement remains a top priority for the Alberta RCMP, and the consistent delivery of these quarterly reports is but one of a number of projects we have underway. Our Body Worn Camera program and our new mobile app for iOS and Android devices are two other initiatives that ensure we remain transparent and accountable to you for the work we do.

Body Worn Cameras increase the transparency of police interactions with citizens. Included in this Community Policing Report package is an updated overview on Body Worn Cameras, which will enter into a field test phase later this year. As mentioned in previous correspondence, the Federal Government recognizes that this was not in the multi-year financial plans for Contract Partners, and thus has agreed to fund the first 3 years of the roll-out. This has allowed some time for Contract Partners to factor this into their future planning processes (i.e. MYFP). As we are currently awaiting the vendor procurement process to finalize, we are unable to provide community-specific cost estimates. Once costing is confirmed, we will provide financial forecasting to our communities with Municipal Policing Service Agreements.

Alberta RCMP has launched a new mobile app for iOS and Android devices, that allows for Albertans to access information without delay. The app is available as a free download through [Apple](#) or [Google Play](#), and will provide your community members with online access to news, crime reporting, detachment locations, crime mapping and statistics. The app also contains links to partner law enforcement services, mental health supports, Crime Stoppers and connects to Alberta RCMP social media accounts. Even though the app provides convenient links to Alberta RCMP social media accounts, it will not replace other methods of crime reporting, engagement, or emergency assistance. I solicit your support to remind all of your community members that social media posts or use of other third-party crime apps are not



appropriate ways to report a crime. The Alberta RCMP app complies with Canadian privacy laws for mobile apps set out by the Office of the Privacy Commissioner of Canada and the Office of the Information and Privacy Commissioner of Alberta and will not track or monitor users in any way.

The attached reporting and attachments, along with your valued feedback and guidance, will reinforce your policing priorities and help ensure we are meeting the growing and shifting demands of your community. As the Chief of Police in your community, I sincerely appreciate and encourage you to reach out with any questions or concerns.

<p><b>Current Status &amp; Results</b></p>	<p>The fourth quarter of 2022 saw 5 complaints of theft under. down from 12 complaints received in the third quarter. There was 1 complaint of theft over \$5000, which was deemed unfounded. 1 of possession of stolen property which resulted in a charge laid. There were 3 reported sexual assaults with 1 charge laid. 28 assaults were reported with 14 charges laid, there were 10 reported assaults causing bodily harm and 7 charges laid. There were 126 complaints of obstruction of lawful use of property down from 202 in the third quarter which resulted in 6 charges being laid and remainder cleared via officer discretion. There were 4 complaints of residential break and enters with 3 charges being laid. Fourth quarter criminal code crime stats were down 6% over the previous third quarter, 124 in 2021 vs 121 in 2022.</p>
<p><b>Priority 2</b></p>	<p>Enhance Public confidence with the RCMP</p>
<p><b>Current Status &amp; Results</b></p>	<p>Within the last year in Alberta news, there has been much talk and speculation concerning the possibility of an Alberta Provincial Police Force. This seems to be driven by Provincial politics. High Level RCMP have had discussions with the Mayor and Senior Administrative Officer in relation to these concerns. The Mayor and SAO are very satisfied with the High Level RCMP and the current levels of service delivery. It is the intention of the High Level RCMP to continue to foster open lines of communication, increase engagement and public confidence in the RCMP.</p> <p>Two Public Town Halls meetings were conducted in January and March with more scheduled in the early Summer between High Level RCMP, Town Council and members of the public. These were well received and the plan is to continue the meetings.</p>
